




Fig.1 Forward Current Derating Curve




Fig.2 Typical Junction Capacitance




Fig.3 Typical Reverse Characteristics




Fig.4 Typical Forward Characteristics




Fig.5 Typical Reverse Recovery Time Versus di/dt




Fig.6 Typical Reverse Recovery Charges Versus di/dt

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
